I am writing on behalf of my clients, Ana Sandoval and her two children, Justin and Andy. Justin has been diagnosed with Occipital Encephalocele and temperature instability. Justin is one year old and is unable to cry, walk, talk, see, or express any of his needs. Justin suffers from seizures on a daily basis. Due to the temperature instability of his body, Ana is unable to take him outside in the winter for a stroll. This is difficult for both Ana and her 2 ½ year old son Andy, as he is also unable to go outside to play.

Recently, your organization gave Ana Sandoval a check for \$2,500. My client is so grateful for the donation given by your Board. Because of your charitable gift, Ana was able to pay her outstanding rent and avoid eviction from her home. She was also able to purchase a new cell phone, as a friend had been helping Ana with her cell phone bill and was no longer able to do so. Every month, Ana is short on her rent. She plans to save the remainder of the money given by your organization, so that she can meet her monthly rent, and also pay for food, diapers, and wipes until her situation improves. This money should last for a while.

Ana's long-term goal is to eventually earn her GED, go to college part-time, and obtain a stable job. Due to Justin's medical issues and limitations, Ana is unable to leave the home at this time to continue her ESL classes at BOCES. Fortunately, BOCES enrolled Ana in their Wilson Tech Home Program. Ana will be able to study English through the comfort of her own home. Ana is very motivated to make positive changes for her family.
